I understand that the Drew Institute on Religion and Conflict Resolution is a live-in study and training program which aims to equip young religious leaders so they can offer "positive alternative influence" to their respective communities in response to radicalism. It was a big challenge but at the same time an opportunity to see our shared values like compassion, justice, peace and harmony with nature.

As Good Shepherd Sisters, our mission is reconciliation. Our congregational thrust of justice and peace continue to ask of us growth in mutual understanding and move from prejudices. I hold these values strongly in my life as a religious and I hope that this opportunity for development will help me contribute more to our congregation and to our mission in our country and in the world.

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
