Students were also given a platform to express their opinion about violence against women and children through creative arts. Some take away messages from the students were: "Respect women, say no to rape", "Real men do not rape.", "Stop rape now, no means no", "Rape cannot be defined from a women's clothing" and lastly, "Respect women as you respect your mother". The program conducted in this institution surely worked as a catalyst in strengthening the protection of women and children in Tambunan.
